**Menlo Park City Manager Named**

MENLO PARK, CA -- Menlo Park Mayor Kirsten Keith announced today that Alex McIntyre of Portland, Oregon will be the next City Manager of Menlo Park, effective March 5, 2012. Mr. McIntyre is currently City Manager for the City of Lake Oswego, Oregon, where he has worked since 2008. Mr. McIntyre replaces Glen Rojas who retired in December after four and one half years as City Manager.

According to Ms. Keith, "Mr. McIntyre is a proven leader who brings with him excellent qualifications for this position. His creativity and sound fiscal management will serve us well in the challenging times before us. We are confident he will continue the tradition of excellence we have built in Menlo Park and will be a tremendous addition to the City's executive management team." Mr. McIntyre was selected from a pool of over 50 candidates based on a selection process that included characteristics suggested in a community survey, an interview panel of community representatives and extensive interviews with City Council members.

Mr. McIntyre was Chief Assistant County Administrator with the County of Marin from 2006-2008, and before that was Town Manager of Tiburon from 2000-2006. Mr. McIntyre has also served locally as Town Manager of Portola Valley from 1997-2000. He holds a Bachelor's Degree in Political Science from the University of California, Irvine, and a Masters of Public Administration from the University of Southern California. Mr. McIntyre has also served the professional community, having worked with the International City Managers Association (ICMA), as well as held committee assignments with the Association of Bay Area Governments (ABAG) and the League of California Cities.

“I am excited about the challenges ahead,” said Mr. McIntyre. “I am excited to join the Menlo Park team and look forward to working on some of the more complex organizational and community issues. I am up for the work ahead. Working thoughtfully, hand-in-hand with the City Council, staff and the community, the City of Menlo Park can bring about the positive results and quality that the community is looking for. I can help in that effort and I am proud to be part of the team.”

Mr. McIntyre’s annual salary will be \$199,000 per year. The City will also make a contribution to a 401-A deferred compensation plan for Mr. McIntyre in the amount of \$9,500 annually. In addition, Mr. McIntyre will receive a monthly car allowance of \$320.00 and receive retirement, health, and term life insurance consistent with the City’s management benefit plan. The City has agreed to make a loan to Mr. McIntyre of up to \$1,350,000 with interest at 3.5% to assist him in the purchase of a home in the City of Menlo Park. Mr. McIntyre will be one of the first employees hired under the reduced 2% at 60, highest three year, plan recently adopted by Council.
