## **County Jail Sgt. Klementowicz Named National Supervisor of the Year**

SOMERVILLE, N.J. – Nicholas Klementowicz, a sergeant at the Somerset County Jail, has been named 2005 National Supervisor of the Year by the International Association of Correctional Officers.
